### **SEVIS-Required Fields**

- Fields required by SEVIS that can be provisioned from the SIS
- Forms I-20 and DS2019
- Originating from SIS
  - Personal/Biographical
  - Academic
- Manually provision data for SEVIS-required field that is not in the SIS. (Ex., City of Birth, Country of Permanent Residence)

#### **Optional Fields**

- Not required for SEVIS, but useful for records and reporting.
  - Full-time courseload indicator
  - Class
  - On-campus housing
  - Adviser
  - Sport
  - Insurance
  - Billing info, financial holds, etc.
  - More as many, or as few as needed, or none!



### **Integration: Data Pitfalls**

- Name conventions
- Hyphens and apostrophes and other diacritical marks
- CIP codes
- Country codes (TDS = ISO2 > SEVIS = FIPS)
- Completeness blank SEVIS-required SIS fields
- Others
- How will TDS help manage these?
  - Truncations, removing "-" and " ' ", country code mapping
